Job Title: Executive Director

Summary:

OutYouth, a successful Austin non-profit with over 35 years of history supporting LGBTQIA+ individuals, seeks a dynamic and experienced full-time Executive Director. This position is key to guiding the organization's strategic direction and ensuring its continued growth and success in serving the community.

The Executive Director will oversee all aspects of OutYouth's operations, working closely with the Board of Directors to establish a long-term vision. They will be responsible for the organization's fiscal health, leading robust fundraising and resource development initiatives, and ensuring the excellence and impact of all programs.

This role requires a leader who can think strategically and practically to implement a comprehensive plan that advances the organization's mission. Key responsibilities include managing and mentoring a dedicated staff, fostering strong community relationships, and serving as the primary spokesperson for OutYouth. The Executive Director will define the infrastructure and strategies needed to support substantial growth and will be deeply involved in all strategic planning and evaluation.

As the leader of the senior management team, the Executive Director reports directly to the Chair of the Board of Directors and is responsible for transparently communicating the organization's progress and needs. The ideal candidate will have significant experience in nonprofit management, a proven record of successful fundraising, and an unwavering commitment to OutYouth's mission.

- Experience working within or alongside LGBTQIA+ or youth-serving organizations.
- Familiarity with the Austin nonprofit landscape.
